



Serving Students with Disabilities (SSD) Criteria for Disability Documentation

The Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504) and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990 state that qualified students with disabilities who meet the technical and academic standards at H. Councill Trenholm State Community College maybe entitled to reasonable accommodations. Under these laws a disability is defined as a physical or mental impairment which substantially limits a major life activity. The Serving Students with Disabilities at Trenholm State does not provide disability documentation for students. **It is the student's responsibility to provide appropriate documentation to this office and to request accommodations. The official documentation has to be a current report (within 3 years of enrollment date), dated and signed. The professional conducting the evaluation cannot be a relative of the student. In all cases, the quality and appropriateness of the documentation given the student's age and requested accommodations will be considered.**

General Considerations:

1. SSD staff reserves the right to accept documentation which varies from the above criteria, but is professionally sound and of high quality, or conversely to reject current documentation viewed as inadequate to support the requested accommodation. At the same time, two sets of similar documentation may not support the same accommodations for two individual students with differing skills, coping strategies, and personal characteristics.
2. Students with obvious severe disabilities will be served pending receipt of documentation.
3. Clients of the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services (ADRS) may or may not be eligible for services, depending upon the disability documentation provided by ADRS. Students will be referred to the ADRS counselor if the documentation is insufficient to support requested accommodations.
4. Students who had an IEP or 504 Plan in high school may or may not be eligible for services, depending upon the disability documentation provided. Testing may be too old, not thorough enough, and/or the diagnosis may be unclear.
