Program Information:

This program will provide students with the necessary training to gain entry-level positions in the field of diagnostic imaging as radiologic technologists. Students will receive clinical training in preparation for the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) examination.

Program Mission:

The Medical Radiologic Technology Program mission is to prepare individuals as entry-level radiographers who are able to fulfill the needs of the medical community in the service area by competently and safely performing diagnostic radiographic procedures on adults and children.

How do I get started?

- Apply to the college.
- Have previous coursework transferred. To view transfer credit awarded, please visit the Trenholm Student Portal. For questions regarding transfer credit, please contact the Director of Records, Dr. Tennie McBryde at 334-420-4306.
- If you are a first time student, you must sit for the ACCUPLACER exam (see exemptions on the Trenholm website).
- Sit for the ACT exam and score 18 or greater. This is a mandatory minimum score and is required of ALL applicants regardless of previous college coursework. There are no exemptions or replacements for this requirement. Visit www.act.org for more information and testing schedule.
- The Medical Radiologic Technology Program is a selective admission program. Completion of a program application is a component of the student profile and does not grant admission to the RAD program.
- All applicants will be ranked according to the composite ACT score with an additional one (1) point being awarded for any of the co-requisite courses completed with a C or better. Tie breakers will be awarded based on ACT subject subsection scores: 1st tiebreaker: Math, 2nd tiebreaker: Science, 3rd tiebreaker: Reading, 4th tiebreaker GPA calculated over the most recent 24 credit hours (high school GPA for those without college courses).
- Upon acceptance to the program, a student should anticipate an immediate out-of-pocket expense for a Background check, Drug Screen, required vaccinations, and CPR/BLS for Healthcare Providers.

**Please note that all general education requirements for the RAD program are co-requisite courses and do NOT have to be completed before applying to the program.*

THE RAD PROGRAM:

- Accepts a class in the Fall of every year.
- Will upload program application to the RAD webpage in April and requires that the application include all required documents:
 - Completed RAD PROGRAM APPLICATION
 - Unofficial copy of the ACT score
 - Unofficial transcripts from ALL colleges
 - Unofficial copy of your Trenholm State transcript showing any transferred courses from other colleges and ACT score
 - A completed Essential Eligibility Criteria Form
- Typically accepts 30 students per year based on clinical availability.
- Is typically Monday-Friday and is 5 semesters in length.
